Disasters Emergency Committee appeal for the Middle East

The DEC is the umbrella body which coordinates disaster relief through all the main charities whenever a major disaster strikes. Once again, this is such a time.

Today, we see the re-established Jewish state (1948) still battling with its neighbours, though now it has very much the upper hand, unlike the context of today's First Reading, from Jeremiah. The Palestinian Arab population, much displaced since 1948, is now another exiled people, squeezed into Gaza and elsewhere. The murderous exploits of their Hamas leaders have brought down the might of Israel on combatants and innocent civilians alike bringing death, hunger, squalor and disease particularly in Gaza and now also to Lebanon.

The DEC, neutral as regards the politics of the situation, have launched a nation-wide appeal to provide humanitarian relief for the victims of the war. You will see the appeal widely publicised and the Church will help you contribute if you wish to do so. *This is not a second collection.*

This weekend and next you can contribute at the end of Sunday masses via the familiar bins at the doors. CAFOD will, as usual, channel our contributions. You may prefer to give online at cafod.org.uk/give

For the ancient Jewish exiles in today's reading, Jeremiah prophesies better days ahead,, as people are allowed back to the land and to Jerusalem which had been completely destroyed by the Babylonians about fifty years before, following several waves of deportation into exile.

May what we read here strengthen our hope that after all these decades, and even centuries, the land of God's chosen people, the land of God's own Son, might come to enjoy that peace which is God's will for each and for all, regardless of race, creed or any other distinction.
